The Ministry of health transferred your Official Information Act request regarding endoscopy procedures to district health boards on 15 September 2020.

 In the last five years how many endoscopy consents were undertaken by nurses and could I please get a breakdown of the procedures these consents related to (e.g, gastroscopy, colonoscopy, ERCP, etc? I also want to know who conducted the procedure.

2. In the last five years how many endoscopy consents were done by doctors and could I please get a breakdown of the procedures these consents related to? I also want to know who conducted the procedure.

At Northland DHB all endoscopy consents are completed by doctors. The procedures were conducted by doctors. A summary of the number of procedures completed is set out below.

In view of the substantial research and collation required to extract the information requested I have decided to refuse this part of your request in accordance with section 18(f) of the Official Information Act. 5. What is best practice in terms of who (i.e. doctors or nurses) should be consenting patients to endoscopy procedures? Should consent be obtained by the clinician conducting the procedure?

As noted above at Northland DHB the endoscopist obtains consent.
