Official Information Act Request

You have asked for information about children presenting at Northland DHB hospitals with dog bites.

The data below is only for children who present at one of our hospitals. We do not capture information for children who present to primary care providers.

1. How many children aged 0-14 have presented to hospital with a dog-related injury in the last year?

From 1 April 2020 to 1 April 2021 there were 47 presentations of children aged 0-14 years for a dog related injury. In some cases the same child may have presented more than once for the same injury. This can occur if a wound dressing needs changing or a complication develops.

2. How many of those children required a procedure (e.g sutures), or admission?

3. What were the ethnic and age demographics of the children?

Of the 47 presentations noted above 33 identified as Māori, 3 as Pacific and 11 as non-Māori.
